POST DENTISTRY HOME CARE INFORMATION

- Please do not feed your pet until the day after surgery. If your pet has had any extractions or gingival surgery we recommend feeding soft food for the first few days post operatively, whether this is canned food or just their dry food watered down with warm water to soften it.
- Any sutures in the mouth are dissolvable.
- Antibiotics are for prevention and treatment of infection. Please start antibiotic pills tomorrow morning, as your pet will have received a penicillin injection today. Please contact us if you are having difficulty medicating your pet.
- Your pet's teeth have been cleaned and polished today. Regular home care should be started the day following dentistry to prevent recurrence of plaque and tartar. Brushing is the most effective technique to keep teeth clean. Dental diets are available that may help slow the progression of tartar accumulation.
- If your pet had any extractions today, they are most likely being sent home with pain medication. This is to begin the day after surgery, as they will have received an injection at the time of surgery.

We appreciate the confidence you show in us by leaving your pet in our care. We realize your pet was probably cleaned and groomed upon admittance. Soiling of the hair coat may occur during dental procedures, or recovery from anesthesia. We have made every effort to ensure your pet's appearance is acceptable when discharged. If we have failed, PLEASE let us know.
